272,974 refugees resettled to the US and 157,375 refugees resettled to Canada between 2015 and 2020.

Resettled refugees face unique health challenges, and health disparities exist compared to US and Canadian bom populations.

There is a need for research standards in refugee health.

There is a lack of an ethical framework to guide research with resettled refugee populations.


